Saturday 14th July 2012

We meet at our designated pick up points to travel by coach to Treloyhan Manor Hotel in Derbyshire for our 7-night half-board stay.

The coach will have an early departure from Willersley Castle Hotel in Derbyshire, and will be picking up at Hopwood (M42 Junction 2), Bristol Gordano (M5 Junction 19), and Exeter Services (M5 Junction 30).

Sunday 15th July 2012

This morning there is an option to attend a local Methodist Church to enjoy Sunday morning worship. We will then return to the hotel for a hot buffet lunch.

The afternoon is free to explore St. Ives and Treloyhan Manor at your leisure. The day will conclude with an evening meal and fellowship time.

Monday 16th July 2012

Today we depart at 9am for a full day coach tour. Our first stop will be Camelford, where John Wesley was a regular preacher from 1747 onwards. At his first visit he was stoned and hounded out of the town, but he later built up a strong following. We will also look into the heritage of Samuel Pollard who was a British Methodist Missionary to China.

We will then travel 20 minutes to the parish church of St Gennys. The church and its sloping graveyard have one of the finest views in North Cornwall, over Bude Bay and across the Bristol Channel to Lundy Island.

Our next stop will be the 14th - 15th century parish church of Week St Mary, south of Bude and close to the Cornwall / Devon border. A further 35 minutes travelling will bring us to Laneast, above the River Inny valley, where the parish church is dedicated to St Michael. It contains a memorial to John Couch Adams, a British mathematician and astronomer. John Wesley preached at these three churches on several occasions.

Following a 25 minute tour we travel on to Altarnun Paris Church on the north-eastern edge of Bodmin Moor. Over the doorway of the old chapel is a profile of the head of John Wesley, carved in 1836 by 18 year old Nevil Northey Burnard, who lived next door.

We then make the short journey to Trewint and the Wesley Cottage. John Wesley often visited Trewint, lodging in Digory Isbell's home, now a museum containing Wesley and Methodist memorabilia. We will then return to Treloyhan Manor for an evening meal.

Tuesday 17th July 2012

Today we travel into the Penwith Peninsula and start our tour in Zennor where in September 1743 John Wesley preached to 300 people. By the road into the village is a large stone on which John Nelson, Wesley's travelling companion in 1743, stood to preach. We will then travel to Rosemergy, where in 1743 John Wesley met Alice Daniel at the roadside. Subsequently she and her husband, John, added two rooms to entertain Wesley and his preachers.

We will re-join the coach to travel to St. Just where both Wesleys preached. In 1755 John preached on the foundation stone of the new society-house, near to the first preaching house - now called 'The Meeting Place' and now occupied by a Methodist.

After which we will travel 30 minutes to St. Buryan. John Wesley visited the parish on several occasions, but was not always well received. He first visited the parish in 1747 and preached in Tredinney. Finally we will travel to Penzance via Newlyn before returning to the hotel.

Wednesday 18th July 2012

A day of leisure, where you are able to relax and explore Cornwall and St. Ives.

Thursday 19th July 2012

After breakfast we will depart at 9am for a full day tour visiting Gwithian Chapel - the last thatched chapel in Cornwall which was built in 1810. We will then travel to Truro Methodist Church, which will be the base for our walking tour of the city, visiting Truro Cathedral, The Royal Cornwall Museum and The Boscawen Street Plaque. We will then travel a short journey to the sole remaining example of three chapels built by Billy Bray; a renowned Cornish tin miner and local preacher for 43 years in the 'Bible Christian Methodist' denomination. Before we return to Treloyhan Manor we will visit John Wesley's favourite preaching place and part of the Cornwall and West Devon World Heritage site - Gwennap Pit.

Friday 20th July 2012

Today we will have a gentle walking tour through St. Ives, where will visit the local chapels including The Wesley Chapel, Bedford Road Methodist Church, Fore Street Methodist Church and the Bible Christian Church. You will then have a free afternoon to spend at leisure.

Saturday 21st July 2012

After breakfast we will depart from Treloyhan Manor to our original pick up points.

2. INSURANCE

3. PRICE

4. EXCURSIONS

We reserve the right to amend any itinerary.

Planned Excursions, walks and any coach travel are included in the price of all holidays and refunds cannot be made for passengers not wishing to go on these. Fares on local transport and admission to attractions, building, grounds etc is not included

5. SMOKING

Smoking is not permitted either in the hotels or on the coaches.

6. BOARDING

Unless special arrangements have been agreed at the time of the booking, it will be assumed that passengers will alight at the same point as that at which they boarded. You are responsible for ensuring you are there at the correct time and we cannot be liable for any loss or expense suffered by passengers because of their late arrival at any departure.

7. LUGGAGE

In the interest of Health and Safety passengers are requested to limit their luggage to one medium sized suitcase, weighing not more than 20kilos per person. In addition, each passenger is allowed one piece of hand luggage of such size that can be stowed on the luggage rack or under a seat.

Christian Guild cannot be held responsible for luggage or personal belongings. It is the customer's responsibility to see that their luggage is loaded on and off vehicles.

8. IF WE CANCEL YOUR HOLIDAY

It is necessary for there to be a minimum number of passengers in order to operate this holiday. Therefore, in certain circumstances we may have to cancel the holiday. If this should occur all monies will be refunded in full.

9. DIETARY NEEDS
